That morning at the **Vista Detention Center** was, for me, a moving experience--seeing a roomful of men, of all ages and ethnicities, who have previously served our country, eager to register and solemnly deliberating their eligibility to register. I was proud to be there, representing League, which supports voting rights for people caught up in the criminal justice system. They are *still* citizens and


supports voting rights for people caught up in the criminal justice system. They are *still* citizens and still deserve the right to have a say about who will represent them.
